Sexual Assault Services

The CWCIC Sexual Assault Services provides 24 hour crisis counseling and support to victims of rape and sexual assault.

Knowledgeable and compassionate advocates assist victims at the hospital or police station who have reported a sexual assault.

Crisis Counselors can be reached 24 hours a day to answer questions and provide information to victims about emotional/psychological issues related to sexual assault.

The CWCIC Sexual Assault Services also provides educational and therapy support groups for victims and significant others.

Domestic Violence Shelter

The Center for Women and Children in Crisis provides emergency shelter for women and children leaving domestic violence.

While staying at the shelter, women and children are provided with support and connected to resources to help them begin living independently and free of abuse.

The shelter can house up to 27 women and children. The facility is equipped with a kitchen, family room, laundry facilities, and play areas.

The Center for Women and Children in Crisis has both Transitional Housing and Aftercare programs to provide women continued support upon leaving the shelter.

Prevention Education/ Speakers Bureau

Over the past several years, highly publicized cases of sexual harassment, domestic violence, and rape have brought these issues into the public eye like never before. As awareness has increased and more survivors have found the courage to reach out, it has become increasingly apparent that violence—the experience of being abused and of abusing others—often begins during the teen years.

Most experts agree that, with few exceptions, violent and abusive behaviors are learned and, therefore, can be unlearned through education and practice. Providing individuals with clear and accurate information on all forms of violence—including sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, and domestic violence—can lead to a reduction of this violence.
